GROW SEEDLINGS IN AN EGG CARTON

Raise a plant from seed to seedling and all in an egg carton!

THINGS YOU'LL NEED:

- Cardboard egg carton
- Potting soil
- Water
- Garden trowel
- Scissors
- Seeds
- Spray bottle
- Large planting pot (optional)

Brief Instructions: Cut a cardboard egg carton in half. Add potting soil to each cup. Create a hole in the center and place one seed in each hole. Cover with soil and spray with water every day. Place the egg carton on a tray and in a warm light-filled spot until the seeds begin to sprout. Then transfer them to a pot or plant them in the ground outside.

HELP SAVE THE BEES



Bees get a bad rap. They buzz around your head, and if you're not careful they can sting. But, they are also vital to our survival and the planet's. They pollinate one-third of the food we eat, including most of the fruits, vegetables, seeds, and nuts that are essential to our diets.

How can you help save the bees?

One of the easiest ways is to plant a bee garden, a safe haven for bees! Fill it will pollen- and nectar-rich flowers by planting a range of shapes, sizes, colors, and bloom times.

You don't need a ton of space. Gardens can be established across yards and in window boxes, flower pots, and mixed into vegetable gardens too. Learn more about saving bees at www.thebeeconservancy.org.

DIY POLLINATOR WATER STATION

Pollinators are bees, butterflies, hummingbirds, ants, bats... pretty much any insect or animal that carries pollen from one flower to another. They help plants become fertilized and produce fruits, seeds, and young plants. It's what helps plants grow!

Pollinators need water to stay hydrated just like we do, and you can help them by making a pollinator water station! First, select a good spot, preferably in an easily accessible area near flowers or vegetables in a garden. Then assemble the water station by:

1. Flipping a pot upside down.
2. Placing a saucer on top of the upside-down pot.
3. Placing beads, marbles or rocks in the saucer so pollinators have something to sit on while they drink.
4. Adding just enough water to the saucer to cover the beads, marbles or rocks. Note: You don't want the water to be too deep.
5. Refilling the water as needed.



Tip: Be sure to change the water in your regularly, or else you will attract mosquitoes instead of pollinators!
