DIY 3-D LADYBUG CRAFT

Get crafty and make these adorable 3-D ladybugs!

- Construction Paper red, black and just a little bit of white
- Scissors
- Stick glue
- Black marker

Directions:

- 1. Cut a circle shape and strips out of red paper.
- 2. Glue the ends of one strip of paper onto the base (as shown). Glue on the next one at a 90° angle to the first one.



- 3. Continue adding strips until the body of the ladybug is full.
- 4. Cut dots, a head and two antenna out of black paper.
- 5. Cut two small oval shapes out of white paper and draw the eyes with black marker.
- 6. Glue on the dots and head with the stick glue.

Nickel 5¢




KEEPING YOUR MONEY SAFE

Keeping your money safe is very important so it doesn't get accidentally lost or stolen.

How can you keep your money safe?

- Put your money in a piggy bank at home. This will help keep it off the floor or other places it shouldn't be.
- Deposit your money in your Friendly's Savings account at the bank. This will keep it safe in case you have an emergency at home.

Let's say you want to buy some candy that costs 12¢. What coins would you need to pay for it? Count the coins and fill in the blanks below.



If you said 2 dimes and 2 pennies, or 2 nickels and 2 pennies, you're right! Now, what if you want to buy a toy that costs \$1.43. Do you know how many of each coin you would need?

Answer: Using the least amount of coins, you would need 5 quarters (\$1.25), 1 dime (10¢), 1 nickel (5¢) and 3 pennies (3¢). When you add them all together, you should get \$1.43.
