DIY ANIMAL PLASTIC BOTTLE PLANTER OR BOWL

Turn 2-liter bottles into your favorite animal plant container or bowl.

What you need:

- Empty 2-liter bottle(s)
- Scissors
- Paint and markers
- Tape or glue
- Plant, candy or knick-knacks to store

Instructions:

- Carefully cut the bottom third of a 2-liter bottle.
- Paint the bottle the color of your choice.
- Use parts of the rest of the bottle to cut out ears and attach them to the top of the opening.



SAY NO TO SINGLE-USE PLASTICS

Not only do single-use plastics clog our landfills and oceans - mostly because there are so many of them and they can sometimes take hundreds of years before they start to break down - but they cost you more money too. That's because you have to buy them over and over again, compared to buying reusable items you can use mulitple times.

Single-use plastics are things made of plastic that you only use one time and then throw away. Some may be recyclable, but others are not. Some examples that we use every day are shown below.










PLASTIC SNACK BAGS

PAPER OR PLASTIC?

 them.
