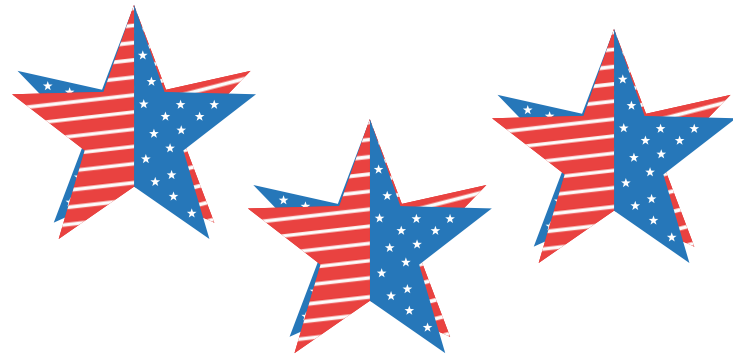
DIY MEMORIAL DAY STAR STAND ALONE DECORATION

Supplies Needed:

- Stiff paper (like card stock or thin cardboard)
- Scissors
- Crayons or markers
- Optional – Printer

Instructions:

1. Two paper stars are needed to make one three-dimensional star. Either draw two identical stars on a piece of stiff paper or print out a star template.
2. Decorate the two stars on both sides, then cut them out.
3. Make one slit in each star. On star #1, the slit goes from an inner corner to the center point of the star. On star #2, the slit goes from an outer corner to the center point.
4. Slip the two stars together through the slits you just cut. For stability, you may have to tape the stars a bit where they meet at the slits.
5. You now have a three-dimensional star decoration!

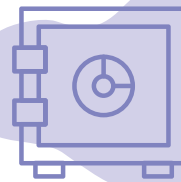

HOW DO BANKS KEEP YOUR MONEY SAFE?

First, banks use super-strong security—kind of like a giant lock on a treasure chest. They have thick vaults (big, heavy doors made of steel) that are very hard to open. Only a few trusted people know how to get inside!

Banks also use technology to protect your money. When you get older, you can check your account online, and the bank has special computer systems that keep your information private. It's like having a secret code that only you and the bank know.

WHAT DOES MEMBER FDIC MEAN?

When a bank says they are “Member FDIC,” that means they are protected by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. So if something happens to the bank, all the bank’s customers can still get their money.

This protection is up to \$250,000 per person and per bank. So you can rest assured your money is safe with banks that are member FDIC!



Another way banks keep money safe is by keeping track of everything. Every time money goes in or out of your account, the bank records it. That way, if something doesn’t look right, they can fix it quickly.

Plus, in the United States, many banks are protected by something called insurance through the FDIC, or Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. This is a government agency that protects your money up to a certain amount if something unexpected happens.



So when you put your money in a bank, you can feel confident—it’s being guarded by strong vaults, smart technology, and careful people. Your savings are in good hands!

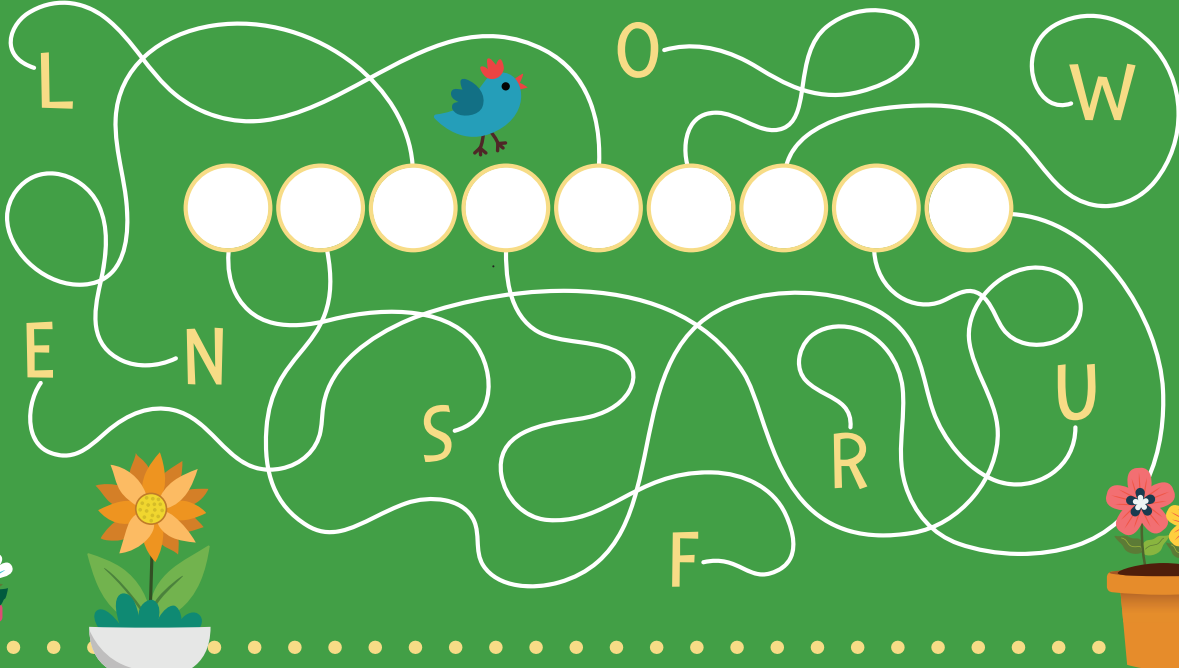
